






THE LAND IS OPEN FOR THE GOSPEL

Open to me the gates of righteousness; I shall enter through them, I shall give thanks to the Lord.

Psalms 118:19

The persistent and fervent prayers of the body of Christ for the unreached Nanumba people group in Ghana is making the land open for the Gospel. It's been four (4) years of pursuing God's vision of reclaiming the North of Africa for Christ through church planting and disciples making among the Nanumbas. Within this years, we have mobilized and sent labourers for both long and short term missions. This year's Go-North Missions among the Nanumbas which was embarked on by twenty five (25) missionaries from 1st to 30th May 2021 is a testimony that the Nanumba Land is Open for the Gospel.

FHI in partnership with Capro Missions have been working among four (4) Nanumba communities namely Koraji, Gimam, Kpanyesi and Ponyila in the Nanumba South District in the Northern Region of Ghana. These are predominantly Muslims communities. There have been several evangelistic outreaches such as school outreaches, house-to-house evangelism, discipleship, follow-ups, visitations and Jesus film show among these communities. Initially, it was difficult to penetrate with the Gospel but we can testify this year to the glory of God that the land is open. Many people were eager to hear the Gospel from the Missions Team.

The amazing testimony is Puduya, the new community we wanted to enter during this year's Go-North Missions. After several interaction with community leaders and the difficulties in getting accommodations for the team, the communities leaders who happens to be Muslims announced to the communities that some Christians have visited the community with the Gospel and encouraged all to give the team their cooperation.

This is an amazing spiritual breakthrough because Puduya is a Muslim community without any church presence. For the first time, the team had three (3) consecutive Church services every Sunday with an average attendance of ten (10) people.

Truly, the land is open to the Gospel. The Kpanyesi chief and household freely hears the Gospel. Everyone in Gimam, Ponyila and Koraji knows the amazing story of the Gospel. No one was left out. From Adult to children. They heard what Jesus Christ did on the cross for them. At the of the missions, thirty four (34) people have given their lives to Christ. Many of them being Muslims. There were approximately five hundred and forty seven (547) people who heard the Gospel throughout this year's Missions.

This year's Go-North Missions started with a three-day training and retreat. The training was meant to equipped team members with the knowledge of christian experiences, assurances, Nanumba people group, team work, child evangelism and reaching out to Muslims. The team also spent days in praying and fasting.

There were many Nanumbas who heard the Gospel but couldn't make a decision due to the fear of persecution. We encourage you all to continue praying that the Lord will break the bondage of fear so that many who heard the Gospel will boldly make a decision to follow Jesus.

MANY DISCIPLES ESTABLISHED IN THE LORD

And when they had preached the gospel to that city and made many disciples.

Acts 14:21b

This year's missions continue to pursue the sole purpose of the missions which is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. The Ponayila team had a discipleship group of seven members which met weekly for discipleship class teachings. The teachings was based on disciple making structure from Christlike Disciples Movement (CDM) Bible college. Puduya team had a secret discipleship for a Muslim convert. Gimam Team had constant household follow up to teach and make disciples. The Koraji Team follow up backsliding church members to encourage, teach and to make them disciples. The Team focused on two (2) disciples by visitation and teaching. A different strategy of one to one disciple making was adopted by the Kpanyesi Team for six (6) disciples.

In all, fifteen (15) people were discipled. They were opened to the teachings and readily asked questions to clear their understanding. We thank God for this disciples of Jesus Christ among the Nanumbas. We pray that more disciples will be made and established in the Lord.

Acts 19:11


God fulfilled the promise of accompanying us for the missions with miracles. The missions team testify of the following amazing miracles of healings.

- #. A young man in Puduya was delivered from spirit of death and Epilepsy after the team prayed for him.
- #. A man from Chichagri, who have been under the attack of the spirit of infinity for about 7years was healed during Sunday Service at Puduya.
- #. In Ponyali, God healed an incapacitated and dumb woman after the team prayed on a cup of water for her to drink.
- # A Kokomba lady attended church for the first time after being healed from chronic body pains during house-tohouse evangelism.
- #. The son of a believer who fellowships with the church in Kpanyesi who was suffering stomach pains and admitted at the hospital was prayed for and healed.
- # A son of community opinion leader who had sort of a swollen reaction on his entire body as a result being bitten by bee received an instant miracle. The team offered to pray with him during house-to-house evangelism and realized that the swollen places where gradually vanishing after the prayers. After some few minutes of leaving their house to the next house, we heard the report that he was fully well now. Praise be to God for miraculous healing.
- #. A woman in Gimam had been sick for a period of time. She has been suffering from severe body weakness. The mission team paid her a visit, prayed with her and she was completely healed when the mission's team visited again in three days time.
- #. A thirteen year old girl who could not hear with her left ear, from birth was prayed for by a member of the team and she heard with that ear instantly.
- #. A Muslim lady in Gimam had been suffering from demonic attacks. This even made her stop schooling. She accepted Jesus into her life and prayers of deliverance was made for her. She is now completely free and has shown great commitment to the things of God since then.

Many others who were sick were also prayed for, and some received their healing. We thank God for working miracles among the people so as to draw them to the saving power of Christ. All Glory to God.

BUILDING GOD'S CHURCH TOGETHER; PHYSICALLY, SPIRITUALLY AND SOCIALLY

So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were saved.

For the past four years, FHI has been watering the community church planted by CAPRO in Gimam. The ministry through short term missions and a serving long term missions continue to build the church spiritually, physically and socially.

Spiritually, The church has grown in numbers and understanding of being a disciple of Christ. The average attendance of Sunday church service has increased from sixteen (16) to twenty five (25). There are many youth who gave their lives to Christ during previous Go-North Missions, they were baptized in water and with the Holy Spirit. These youth joined the church in Gimam and being discipled to God's Glory. The missions team had always been following up on souls in Gimam. They have continued to strengthen the church to grow in the Lord. In all, eight (8) new converts have been added to the church.

Socially, The missions team had constantly share clothes, toiletries and education support with members of the church. FHI's ministry supported two young people in the church to enrol in Senior High school.

Physically, the Go-North missions team continue to help the Gimam local church in building a place of worship under project "Eradicating of Churches under Tress (E-Cut Project). In previous missions, we have helped in moulding blocks. This year, we donated benches and roofing sheets to the church and assisted in cutting woods for the roofing of the temple and a two-bedroom missions house.

In order to engage the youth in Kpanyasi, the Missions Team organize a football match between the Missions Team and Kpanyesi youth.

The atmosphere was filled with expectation and excitement as Kpayansi prepares for the football match with their visitors who have been in the community for close to a week. The chief and his elders together with other opinion leaders have been duly informed concerning the up coming match. And that caused the chief to remember the days of his youth when he was once a strong defender, no striker can by-pass.

The D-Day finally arrived and the game they have always wished for was here. The referee whistled for the match to commenced. The defenders on both sides were defending with all their heart and strength and the strikers from both sides were bent on scoring.

After the first-half, both teams had kept a clean sheet. The referee whistled for the players to assemble for the second half. Those who will be substituted have been substituted and both teams were anticipating a win over the other at all cost.

The second half began with expectation and carefulness not to concede a goal. This time, both teams were strongly defending their goalpost. Close to the end of the second half, the community team scored one goal against the missions team. A few minutes after the goal, the referee whistled to bring the game to an end. The Kpayansi community team could not hold their joy and excitement as they have emerged as the winner of the game. It was an exciting game which attracted the entire youth in the community.

At the end of match, Mrs. Yemi, our host missionary's wife, shared the gospel with the youth to run the race of life not to only win on earth but to also win in heaven. She shared the Gospel with over hundred (100) youth gathered after the match. We thank God for the opportunity to share the Gospel through sports.

The Missions Team at Koraji engaged the community on health and environmental issues. The focus was on the dangers of smoking and how to keep the environment clean. After initial talk with community leaders, the team organized an health workshop to educate the community on how to keep the environment clean and dangers for smoking. The meeting was attended by the entire community and was spearheaded by the health team from Wulensi clinic. The community expressed gratitude for the talk and expect a change in the behavior of the community. It's our prayer that the workshop will yeild the anticipated outcome.

Besides, the Missions Team at Puduya on behalf of FHI donated some medical equipment and First Aid medication to the Chip compound. The Chip compound is the only health facility available to the community. It lacks basic medical equipment to serve the community, especially children and women. The sought for their immediate needs and this donation was provided as a means of supporting the community.

Moreover, the missions team members offered volunteer teaching at the various schools in the communities. It offered us the opportunity to interact with the pupils and to share the Gospel with them. Both pupils and teachers were grateful for such a kind gesture of helping them. All Glory to God.

The most common barrier to cross cultural missions is language. In spite of the effort to bridge this barrier with translators or translation, there's a persistent language barrier for missionaries serving among the unreached. Over the years, language barrier have been a challenge to our Go-North Missions team.

In response to finding solution to this challenge, the missions mobilizing team will be embarking on a mobilization drive on campuses to mobilize Nanumbas and Walas or individual who can speak Dagbani or Wala. The campaign is dubbed; "Reaching your own." It's our prayer that we will be able to mobilize Nanumbas and Walas Christians in the south to join us for subsequent Go-North Missions.

In other instances, the provided accommodations had several safety and health concerns. This couldn't stop the spirit-filled missions team members from pursuing the reason for going to the field.

It's our prayer that God will supply the resources for the building of missions houses or touch the hearts of Nanumba Christians to offer accommodations for subsequent Go-North Missions.
